



PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM CURRICULUM

THREE-YEAR OLD PRESCHOOL (K3)

A typical school day would consist of Bible, numbers, phonics, and play time in the following schedule:

FOUR-YEAR OLD PRESCHOOL (K4)

Bible, A Beka Books

Students are taught Sunday-School style lessons, memorize verses and songs.

Skills Development, A Beka Books

Students are taught habits, colors, cutting skills, sound identification, visual perceptions, same concepts, writing readiness, telephone skills, manners, motor coordination activities, listening/thinking activities, and health and safety visuals

Phonics, A Beka Books

Students are taught to recognize all upper and lower-case letters in the alphabet, concepts of five vowels, constant-vowel blends, one and two-vowel words, , short, long, and silent vowel sounds

Writing, A Beka Books

Students are taught to write all upper and lower-case letters, blends, and words learned in phonics.

Activity Time, A Beka Books

Includes Music; Art, and Community Helpers.

Numbers, A Beka Books

Students are taught to count from 1-100, before and after numbers, concepts of more and less, larger and smaller, and number families, writing numbers 1-20, and combinations $1+1=2$ through $9+1=10$.
